**Brian Baldauff** is currently Assistant Professor of Percussion at West Liberty University in West Liberty, West Virginia. In addition to directing the percussion ensemble, teaching applied lessons, and percussion fundamentals courses, he also directs the athletic bands including the Marching Hilltoppers and the WLU Pep Band. Brian is a versatile performer and pedagogue whose interests span contemporary and historic percussion literature, electronic sound, and chamber music.

Active as a performer, Brian has appeared with symphony orchestras in Florida and Michigan and as a featured artist at the Percussive Arts Society International Convention. In demand as a clinician, he has presented at Percussive Arts Society Days of

Percussion and at high schools and universities across the United States. As a founding member of the Denkyem Percussion Group, he toured Costa Rica performing concerts and teaching masterclasses. Recent projects include a recording project with the John Psathas Percussion Project (JP3) for a forthcoming album release on Rattle Records.

Additionally, Brian is very active in the Percussive Arts Society community where he is currently serving as President of the West Virginia chapter. Brian completed his undergraduate work in music education at the University of Central Florida and received the Master of Music from the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. His primary percussion teachers include Jeffrey Moore, Michael Udow, Joseph Gramley, and John W. Parks IV. He is currently a Doctor of Music candidate at the Florida State University.
