Andrew H. Harper, Ph.D., had a long career as a musician and educator. He spent the last 40 years of his life shaping Mobile's cultural realm, championing local musicians, and working to keep the arts alive on the Gulf Coast. He founded the Port City Symphony and helped pave the way for the creation of the Mobile Symphony Orchestra. Dr. Harper chaired the University of South Alabama's Music Department from 1982 until his retirement in 1999. He continued to attend concerts at the Laidlaw Performing Arts Center, encouraging and supporting generations of students. After he died in May 2020, he was honored by the Mobile Symphony as well as USA colleagues.
