The shipper must complete the <u>International Shipping Export Control Review Worksheet</u> to help ensure those shipping internationally do not inadvertently violate export or trade laws.

Failure to follow requirements for international shipping can lead to violations of federal laws including:

Civil penalties up to \$300,000 per violation

Criminal penalties up to \$1 million per violation and/or up to 20 years in prison

False export declarations fines of \$10,000

The Office of Research Compliance and Assurance will review the shipment details and provide a letter of determination. A copy of the letter must be provided to the Office of Commercialization and Industry Collaboration.

Note about Export Control laws: It is unlawful to send or take export controlled information or materials out of the United States or to transfer export controlled materials or information to "foreign persons" inside or outside the United States, unless an exemption under the regulation applies or the University obtains an export license. You may be personally liable for violating the International Traffic in Arms Regulations ("ITAR"), the Export Administration Regulations ("EAR"), or one of the many other regulations by other U.S. administrative agencies for making unlawful transfers; violation of each of these regulations is punishable by fines of up to \$1,000,000 and or prison terms up to 10 years. Material herein will not be further distributed to others outside of the individuals and entities listed above without the prior written consent of yourself and the University of South Alabama, and in any event shall not be distributed in violation of any of the U.S. export control laws.
