

Dr. Ronald Kiene and Dr. Alison Robertson, Department of Marine Sciences and the Dauphin Island Sea Lab, conduct research to better understand the factors that influence the occurrence of Ciguatera Fish Poisoning (CFP), the most common form of phytotoxin-borne seafood poisoning in the world. Over the past five year, more than \$4 million in funding has been provided by the National Oceanic and Atmosphere Administration for this research.

Dear Colleagues:

For FY 2013, the University received a total of \$57,444,136 in externally sponsored awards. The *Annual Report for FY 13* is produced by the Office of Research and Economic Development and details externally-funded research activity, clinical trials, intellectual property activity and research expenditures. Included in this report is detail about awarded investigators which provides information attributed to the principal investigator and co-investigators, crediting individuals associated with successfully awarded projects.

Highlights of the *Annual Report for FY 13* include the following:

- Record levels of funding were received in the Colleges of Arts and Sciences and Engineering, the School of Computing, and the University Library.
- FY 13 was a record year for the number of proposals submitted and the number of proposals funded.
- The total funding received by academic units increased by 19% over FY 12.
- This year's annual awards include \$19,172,629 in Pell grants and other federal student assistance programs.
- Research expenditures in FY 2013 totaled \$45,702,217. The report includes two sections – Expenditures by Division and Expenditures by Source.
- Clinical trials activity as reported by the South Alabama Medical Science Foundation includes 57 awards totaling \$1,108,396.

Gross licensing revenues received in FY 2013 are reported by the Office of Intellectual Property Management and total \$2,041,257. The larger portion of this revenue was attributable to license agreement between the South Alabama Medical Science Foundation and a subsidiary of Merck KGaA. Other key statistics include thirteen (13) invention disclosures submitted, twelve (12) U.S. patents filed, three (3) U.S. patents issued, and one (1) license/option agreement executed.

I look forward to working with all of you to be a strong partner in the advancement of fundamental and translational research here at the University of South Alabama.



DISTRIBUTION OF SPONSORED FUNDING


BY FUNDING SOURCE FISCAL YEAR 2013

BY FUNDING SOURCE FISCAL YEAR 2013



BY FUNDING SOURCE FISCAL YEAR 2013





DISTRIBUTION OF AWARDS


BY FUNDING PURPOSE FISCAL YEAR 2013

BY FUNDING PURPOSE FISCAL YEAR 2013



BY FUNDING PURPOSE FISCAL YEAR 2013



BY FUNDING PURPOSE FISCAL YEAR 2013





BY UNIVERSITY TOTAL FY 09 - FY 13



BY ACADEMIC FY 09 - FY 13



HEALTH SCIENCES FY 09 - FY 13


