- Destiny Alvarado: Study Abroad
 - I was the Transfer-at-Large last year and I am an intern at the Study Abroad office, did study abroad for 2 weeks then came back to be an intern
 - 90% of study abroad alumni got into their choice of grad school, typically people who study abroad have higher GPAs, graduate on time
 - You can earn credit abroad, there are three types of programs, you receive transfer credit from another university and another study can come to our university
 - Freshmen and transfers can receive certain credit with certain scholarships
 - Faculty-led programs are the most popular, they are going to Australia from MCOB, it varies
 - Over 800 programs in 60 different countries, you gain an international perspective, a lot of programs are taught in English, but you can learn a language while there
 - Eligibility requirements: 2.2 gpa, some require a 3.0, pass a Dean of Students review, you have to travel to a travel advisory
 - Program types: faculty led a professor from South will take you, typically 10 days to 6 weeks and strictly in the summer, affiliate programs – they will not fit into your major plan, cultural immersion
 - You can use your FASFA, there is many scholarships they offer, they do 2 scholarship workshops each semester, offer in the Fall and the Spring, and can award up to \$5,000
 - If you already have a passport, it needs to be good for 6 months past when you come back
 - You can get certification through studying abroad in any part of your major, shows interpersonal skills and intercultural skills
