Carolyn M. Dahlgren was born and raised in Mobile but now lives in Erie, Colorado. Her parents, Margaret Mary Swann and Arnold William Dahlgren were also from Mobile. Her mother graduated from Convent of Mercy in 1938 while her father graduated from Murphy High School in 1931. Her paternal grandfather, Sten Aron Dahlgren emigrated from Sweden sometime before the turn of the century before serving the community as a deputy sheriff, a qualified elector for the Democratic Party, and an engineer.
